1000 patients by July 2018 - YES WE CAN !!!





The CRASH-3 Nigeria meeting in Ibadan was a great success! It was fantastic having teams from across the country coming together to figure out the best ways to ensure that we meet our goal of randomising 1000 CRASH-3 Nigeria patients by the end of the year. We will circulate the Ibadan Declaration (which is a summary of points agreed at the meeting) shortly. In the meantime below are some of your ideas on how to ensure that every hospital in Nigeria randomises patients into the trial every week:

- Make randomising a patient part of the standard protocol in your accident and emergency/ trauma units.
- Build a strong team that includes all relevant persons at your hospital.
- Hold regular refresher sessions with your team to ensure that they understand the importance of the trial and that they are confident carrying out their roles.
- Inform the coordinating centre of other motivated colleagues who would like to start the trial at their hospitals.
